This report concerns events which have taken place during the year 2005.

## OBITUARIES

The International Fencing Federation has been hit, during this period, by the loss of several friends :

- **Mr Félix GALIMI (ARG)**

Félix Galimi died on 2 January 2005 at the age of 84 in Buenos Aires.

Famous and remarkable fencer of the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s, Félix Galimi obtained numerous national and international titles. Pan-American Champion in the individual competition, three times national champion at foil, several times champion of South America and of Rio de la Plata. He represented three times Argentina in the Olympic Games.

- **Dr Eduardo HAY (MEX)**

Former President of the Mexican Fencing Federation, former President of the Pan-American Fencing Federation and IOC Honorary Member, Dr Eduardo Hay died on 5 January 2005 at the age of 90.

Coordinator of the International Congresses and Chief of Protocol for the Games of the XIX Olympiad in Mexico City, Eduardo Hay was also Vice-President of the National Olympic Committee and Director of the Mexican Olympic Sports Centre.

- **Master Jerzy PAWLOWSKI (POL)**

Master Pawlowski died unexpectedly on 11 January 2005 at the age of 72.

In twenty years, he was world finalist 18 times. Individually, he won three world titles and one Olympic title in Mexico in 1968, for a total of 10 Olympic or world medals. Jerzy Pawlowsky is considered as one of the greatest world sabre fencer of the second half of the XX<sup>th</sup> century.

Master Pawlowski was also very popular thanks to the publication of a book on the Olympic Games and his active participation in numerous conferences. He leaves the image of an incomparable champion, of sublime grace, with a very fine technique and amazing tactical ability.

- **Mr Ralph ZIMMERMAN (USA)**

International Referee, Ralph Zimmerman died on 29 January 2005 at the age of 65.

Impartial and excellent analyst, he officiated at numerous Senior and Junior World Championships, World Cups and three times at Olympic Games, out of which a final.

Active member for more than twenty years within his Federation, he received the USFA Referee Emeritus, the highest honour granted by his Federation.

- **Mrs Robyn CHAPLIN (AUS)**

Ms Robyn Chaplin, holder of the Australian Order of Merit, died unexpectedly on 2 February 2005 at the age of 68.

A former fencer and national finalist, she held numerous high positions such as the one of President of the Australian Fencing Federation, Vice-President of the Commonwealth Fencing Federation or Founding Director of the Confederation of Australian Sport. She successfully hosted the Fencing World Championships in Melbourne (AUS) in 1979 and was part of the team working on the organisation of the fencing events at the Olympic Games in Sydney (AUS) in 2000.

- **Mr Orlando AZINHAIS (POR)**

Mr Orlando Azinhais, several times national champion, Olympic competitor and former member of the FIE Medical Commission passed away on 12 March 2005 at the age of 71.

A cultured man, he was a specialist in sport history and in fencing history in particular. Mr Azinhais dedicated his entire life to the teaching and promotion of fencing.

- **Mr Béla RERRICH (HUN)**

One of the outstanding figures of the international fencing world, Béla Rerrich died in Stockholm (SWE) on 25 June 2005 at the age of 88.

He took part in three editions of the Olympic Games and was a member of the Hungarian silver medal-winning fencing team in 1956 in Melbourne. He later moved to Sweden, and was considered as the founder of Swedish fencing.

- **Mr Yves BRASSEUR (BEL)**

Former Olympic sabre fencer, Mr Yves Brasseur died in Ghent on 11 August 2005 at the age of 62. Talented fencer for many years, he achieved significant results on national as well as international levels.

- **Mr Renzo NOSTINI (ITA)**

Renzo Nostini, Member of Honour of the FIE, passed away in Roma (ITA) on 30 September 2005 at the age of 91.

He has directed the Italian Fencing Federation for 32 years (from 1961 to 1993) and was Vice-President of the Italian National Olympic Committee, whose he was Honorary President, and Vice-President of the FISU.

Renzo Nostini practised several sports (water-polo, rugby, pentathlon), but this is at sabre and foil that he distinguished himself with 4 silver medals in team : 2 at the London Olympic Games in 1948 and 2 at those of Helsinki in 1952. He was also several times World Champion with a total of 7 titles. He was decorated with the Athletic Gold Medal, the Gold Star of Sport Emeritus and the Silver Olympic Order.

- **Mr. Emile Thomas LUMINGU NDUNGUDIANI (COD)**

Assistant to the Secretary General of the Congo Fencing Federation, Mr. Emile Thomas Lumingu Ndungudiani passed away on December 26, 2005.

## I. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

### 1. MANAGEMENT

The management operations of the FIE have been intensive.

**The Executive Committee has met 3 times** : on 14 January 2005 in Doha (QAT), on 23 and 24 April 2005 in Lausanne (SUI) and on 11 November 2005 in Doha (QAT).

**The Members of the Bureau** were present at the Junior/Cadet World Championships of Linz (AUT). They met on 12 October 2005 in Leipzig during the World Championships and on 10 November in Doha (QAT).

The FIE annual **General Assembly** took place on 22 March 2005 in Linz (AUT).

**26 consultations of the Executive Committee** took place by fax and e-mail during the year, when an urgent decision was necessary. **1 consultation of National Federations** has also been carried out during the year.

The arrangements put in place by the administrative bodies were regularly communicated to FIE Members by **20 Letters of Information** and **17 Urgent Letters**.

These letters and their attachments were sent by electronic mail to national federations, Members of Honours, Members of the Executive Committee and Presidents of Confederations, thus avoiding delays in their receipt by federations, as well as the cost of postal charges and paper generated by the previous method of sending by post.

The various FIE ranking lists were also put into PDF format and sent to the national federations by electronic mail.

### 2. NEW AFFILIATIONS

The Executive Committee gave provisional approval to 3 new federations in 2005 :

- The Fencing Federation of Afghanistan (AFG)
- The Fencing Federation of United Arab Emirates (UAE)
- The Fencing Federation of the Democratic Republic of Congo (COD)

The FIE has at present **118 member federations**.

### 3. CALENDAR

- **Grand Prix**

All Grand Prix competitions at each weapon were subject to the appointment of referees by the Executive Committee, on the advice of the Refereeing Commission. The following were allowed :

- for organisers to select a sufficient number of referees from neutral countries;
- for fencers to benefit from referees of a similar standard;
- for the Refereeing Commission to observe these referees with a view to their eventual appointment to other competitions.

#### 5. DOPING

The fight against doping continued throughout the season. Only **one case of doping use** was noted and sanctioned. This is *Mr Jung Hwan Kim (KOR)* positive at the Hydrochlorothiazide and who was suspended for one year.

- **596 doping controls** were carried out on the occasion of World Cup competitions (apart from the World Championships), during the season

2004/2005:

- 246 controls during the Junior World Cup
- 234 controls during the Senior World Cup
- 116 controls during the Team World Cup

- **32 out-of-competition doping controls** were carried out by WADA at random in 2005, while 13 had been carried out in 2004 and 40 in 2003.

## 7. INTERNET WEB SITE

Thanks to a new design, the FIE Internet Website is more attractive. Videos and « highlights » of the World Championships are among others available. During the Leipzig World Championships, 77'778 videos were viewed by visitors coming from 87 countries.

The creation of a search tool was introduced in order to facilitate the surfing and numerous links enable the visitor to access to a wide range of information. Furthermore a Result file including the results, per weapon, of World Championships and Olympic Games back to 1956 was added. A special page dedicated to the refereeing was created. We shall soon find new pages dedicated to the Confederations as well as athletes cards.

- **Statistics** : The site registered a monthly average of 42'032 connections and 286'172 visited pages. A peak of 63'202 connections and 396'213 visited pages was registered in October because of the Leipzig World Championships.

### **III. DEVELOPMENT OF FENCING WORLDWIDE**

#### **ACTIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE FIE**

The actions of development and technical support of the FIE intensified and diversified to make them more profitable and more effective. We wanted to establish all the stages which turn out necessary to attain the final goal of each federation: **the visible improvement of sporting results**.

The activities diversified in the following way:

1. **Activities of basic training** for the young candidates for the fencing master's degree by our stable schools and our itinerant school.
2. **Activities of improvement and long-term recycling (3 months)** for the trainers. This activity was conducted in association with the Olympic Solidarity in specialized institutions.
3. **Trainings camps for the athletes** before the World Championships organized by the FIE. This new activity, which is completely financed by the FIE, has for main objective to offer the possibility to the fencers coming from all continents to **prepare** together, as well as **to participate** in World Championships.

#### **1. FENCING MASTERS SCHOOLS**

##### **A. The School of Oceania in Melbourne**

This FIE training school is the sole and unique possibility for Fencing Coaches to get trained and improve their skills in this region.

Thanks to this help from the FIE, the trainer and the director of the OFMA (Oceania Fencing Masters Academy) has the possibility to organise training and improvement courses for the various States of Australia.

These trainings are part of the national system of accreditation of professional competences. The National Technical Director works in close collaboration with the school by assuring the administrative part of the accreditation of the trainers. The NTD provides the trainers with all the important information received from the FIE and from the AFF. The most qualified trainers in Queensland, Western Australia and in

the South organize training courses for the young trainers of their region. They work in close collaboration with the national trainer, discover and identify those young fencing having a high-level potential.

The Oceanian Confederation organizes periodically meetings on the development of fencing in the region. The Oceanian Confederation established contacts with the OSFO (Olympic Sports Federations of Oceania), which with the assistance of the Australian Olympic Committee and the support of the FIE, will get in touch with the various countries of the continent to encourage and assist them in the creation of a national fencing federation.

Master Martin Brill, who is also the President of the Fencing Federation of New Zealand, organizes training and improvement courses on behalf of the school of Oceania.

The recycling system put in place by the NCAS, requires that all coaches re-confirm their professional knowledge. The accreditation is valid for a period of 4 years. The Fencing Masters school took care of all the training courses as well as the recycling examinations. Below, the number of trainers re - confirmed on October 15th, 2005:

- Level 2 : 17 trainers
- Level 3 : 25 trainers

Refereeing is a new activity for the school. A training and an examination of national referee will be included to the 2006 programme.

## **B. The School of Dakar**

It hosted the 3rd promotion in January, 2003. The duration of the training is of two years. The current promotion will end its training in January, 2006. This report covers mainly the activities which took place during the academic year of 2004-2005.

## **I. The students**

Its purpose is the training of African technicians, mainly stemming from the African South Sahara. African. The students who compose this promotion divide up as follows: Niger 2, Burkina Faso 2, Guinea 1 and Mali 2 (one of them was not able to end the training for domestic reasons).

These students are accommodated in full boarding in a town located at 5 minutes on foot from the national stadium where the classes take place. Their expenses are fully paid by the FIE thanks to the subsidy assigned to the School of Dakar.

The FIE subsidy covers the expenses of the students, the speakers (permanent and temporary ones), the purchase of didactic material and the functioning of the School.

It is necessary to mention that all the students in training were sent by the new federations created 2 or 3 years ago and which do not have the financial means to take care of their trainees.

## **II. The training programme**

The education programme includes besides the education of fencing, necessary additional theoretical subjects in the field of the sport (anatomy, physiology, psychology of sport, theory and economic planning of education and biomechanics).

## **III. The teachers and the experts**

The additional subjects are taught by Professors of the National Institute of Sports of Dakar.

The teaching of fencing subjects is insured in a permanent way by the Senegalese Fencing masters stemming from the first promotion of the School (5), assisted by Master Octavian Zidaru, Technical Director of the Romanian Fencing Federation.

Previously, the FIE had sent to the EIMA Master Gamal El Shimi, who had stayed in Dakar from 6 till 13 April 2004, to oversee the teaching of the young Senegalese Fencing masters who began as trainers of trainers.

As Master El Shimi is not longer available, they could benefit from the expertise of Master Zidaru thanks to the collaboration of Mrs Ana Pascu, President of the Romanian Fencing Federation and Member of the Executive Committee, who was kind enough to make him available for the School of Dakar.

And so Master Zidaru made two stays in Dakar, one from February 7th till March 7th, 2005 and the other from 5 till 31 May 2005, to make sure that the education programme was followed and to make the necessary adjustments if necessary.

Master Zidaru's 2nd stay was the occasion for the Senegalese Federation to benefit from its expertise in the organization of international competitions. He took an active part to the organization of the Grand Prix and team World cup at Men Sabre which took place for the first time in Dakar. The students could participate in their first international competition during the Grand Prix organized in Dakar.

## **IV. End of the lessons and the final evaluation**

The end of the lessons for this promotion is foreseen in mid-December on 2005. The students will have 15 days to prepare the final examination which will take place the 2nd fortnight of January 2006 in the presence of Master Zidaru and Ioan Pop.

## **C. The School of South Africa**

This school allows the training and the qualification of young Fencing masters who can work in the clubs of the various regions of South Africa.

### **Province of Gauteng**

Mister Kovrijnikh pursues his development programme for the black community of Mamelodi. Mister Mpho Nkoane continues his work and concentrates on the education of club trainers for the city of Soweto. The fencers of Mamelodi and Soweto participate regularly in competitions at a regional and national scale.

### **Cape Town**

The training school of Cape Town has maintained its activity under the lead of Misha Galoukhin and the students will have their diplomas examinations in February 2006. The 8 candidates for the examination are the following ones: Bosman Bram, De Bruto Petro, Mlambo Stevens, Nkoane Mpho, Raitt Gwen, Rautenbach Jaqueline, Simons Alison and Titus Marius.

The trainers who passed their diploma in the previous years still contribute to the education and to the initiation of fencing in clubs and provinces. To mention the enthusiastic participation of a big number of young fencers of South Africa in World Championships. According to the South African federation this participation was the direct consequence of the FIE assistance and support to the training school.

Unfortunately, for financial and personal reasons, the school activity is only part-time. The South African Federation is looking for opportunities to create a permanent school in Gauteng and obtain an international vocation for possible foreign candidates from nearby countries such as Namibia, Botswana, Lesotho or Swaziland.

## **D. The itinerant school of South America**

Guatemala, Ecuador and Paraguay benefited from periods of training realized by Cuban experts. The trainings lasted between 6 and 12 months and the experts were taken care by the FIE.

## **2. TRAINING COURSES WITH THE COOPERATION OF THE OLYMPIC SOLIDARITY**

### **Development of the structure of national fencing in Turkey.**

Master Antonio Signorello made a long-term training (three months) in Turkey from June 15th till September 14th. He spent 3 weeks in Istanbul, 1 month in Ankara and 3 weeks in Izmir. He worked concretely with fencers and trainers and so discovered the major obstacles which prevent the Turkish fencing from obtaining results on an international level. According to the expertise, the priority problems to be resolved are the following ones:

1. The quality of the frame and the lack of methodology of the Fencing masters
2. The lack of organization of clubs
3. The impossibility of organising long-term programs
4. The division of forces and means in practising 6 weapons

Solutions to the different problems were suggested by Antonio Signorello, who considers that the potential to improve the results exists.

### **Development of the structure of national fencing in Argentina**

The Cuban expert Juan Ramon Velazquez Fernandez made a long-term training course (6 months) in Argentina. The tasks to be carried out were the following ones:

- The technical frame of the epee fencers and all other fencers liable to participate in World Championships and in Pan-American Championships.
- Include in this work the high-level trainers
- To visit systematically the various fencing halls in Buenos Aires by observing the work of the trainers who participated in the trainings.

The objectives:

- To harmonize the resources of the Argentinean Federation by obtaining results as a priority objective.
- Improve the level of the Fencing masters who participate in the training by involving them directly in the preparation work of the national teams.
- Insure the continuity of the improvement process of the trainers in question by a permanent analysis and evaluation.

### **3. COURSES AND PROGRAMME WITH THE OLYMPIC SOLIDARITY**

#### Improvement courses of the International Fencing Federation

As for the previous years, the FIE organized an international improvement course of one week just before the Junior/Cadet World Championships of Linz with fencers coming from the following countries : ISL, RSA, AZE, BUL, CAN, CRO, ECU, CHI, IND, IRL, KIR, MDA, PHI, POR, ROM, SCG, VEN, VIE, COL, GEO, JOR, NZL, SEN, TUN, TUR, UKR, ALG, AUS, BRA, EGY. All the fencers have participated in the World Championships. The expenses related to these participations in the training as well as the World Championships (travel, accommodation, food, allowances and technical supervision by Bulgarian Fencing Masters) have been covered by the FIE.

Our second training began one week before the World Championships and took place in Leipzig. The countries represented were the following ones : BRU, THA, TUR, JOR, TPE, KUW, MAS, ECU, PHI, NZL, VIE, ISL, IND, AUS, SEN, CHI, ARG, GUA, CAN, DEN, COL, CRC, FIN, RSA, CRO, BRA, SCG, MEX, CUB, BUL, JPN, HKG, MAC, EGY, TUN, CHN, KOR, ALG, AZE.

### **4. MATERIAL AID**

The following countries have benefited from material aid : Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Brazil, Brunei, Bulgaria, Chile, Colombia, Guatemala, Iceland, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Paraguay, Romania, Serbia and Montenegro, Senegal, the Slovak Republic, Ukraine, Uruguay, Venezuela, Vietnam and Yemen.
